


Devils Garden Campground





Generator Hours 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. & 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.



Please do not feed the wildlife!

Regulations

- · Do not feed the wildlife no matter how cute they are.
- · 10-person maximum limit per individual campsite.
- Generators may only be used between the hours of 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Strong gusty winds are common. Make sure everything in your site is secured.
- Camping fees are to be paid within 30 minutes of occupying campsite.
- Sites may not be saved or bought for parties arriving later.
- If your envelope stub is not displayed in the site box, the site will be considered unoccupied and available for use.
- Group campsites are by reservation. No RV's or sleeping in vehicles allowed in the parking areas of group sites.
- Reservations for individual and group campsites may be made by contacting www.recreation.gov four days in advance.
- 7-day limit (consecutive or non-consecutive) per camping party in any 30-day period and 14-day limit per year.
- Pets must be leashed. They are not allowed on trails, overlooks or anywhere in the backcountry. Be courteous and clean up after your pet. Do not leave your pet in a vehicle unattended if temperatures are above 65 degrees.
- Fires are allowed in fire pits/grills only, no ground fires.
 No collecting of firewood in the park. Never leave a fire unattended.
- Vehicles and bicycles must stay on the paved or graveled area
 of the campsite. They must stay on roads and are not allowed
 on any trails.
- The use of skates, skateboards, scooters, rollerblades, or similar devices is strictly prohibited.
- RV's may not connect a water hose to any water station for water filling. Only water jugs and bottles may be filled.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Only registered campers are allowed to enter campground or occupy campsites between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- Speed limit is 15 MPH in the campground and Devil's Garden area.
- · Check-out time is 10 a.m.
